PASTOR JEANETTE'S ARTICLE

"Don't Harm Yourself! We are all here!" Acts 16:28

The above verse is said by the Apostle Paul to a jailer. Paul and Silas had been imprisoned for spreading the Gospel throughout the ancient world. Acts 16:25-28 says, "About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the other prisoners were listening to them. Suddenly there was such a violent earthquake that the foundations of the prison were shaken. At once all the prison doors flew open, and everyone's chains came loose. The jailer woke up, and when he saw the prison doors open, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself because he thought the prisoners had escaped. But Paul shouted, 'Don't harm yourself! We are all here!'"

I recently heard this quote in a very different context. It was highlighted at the start of a continuing education class. Though obviously different from its original meaning, the teacher noted that it is a good verse to consider when talking about suicide. That is, when people are contemplating suicide, we hope they will hear loud and clear that there is a community of faith that deeply loves them and will walk with them through whatever struggle they are facing. People are here to help them turn from despair and choose life. Therefore, the call to such individuals who are contemplating suicide is to "not harm themselves" but, rather, remember that we (the body of Christ) are "all here."

The course offered many important insights. In my mind, the most important insight given by the course's instructors was their advice to ask people directly if they are contemplating suicide. I encourage you all to follow the instructors' guidance to ask people directly if they are considering suicide if you notice changes in their behavior or if their conversations concern you. Many times, people are worried about offending people by asking them if they are contemplating suicide. But most of the time, people are not offended by the question (even if they are not contemplating suicide), and, in fact, may be grateful for someone's willingness to talk openly with them about their feelings and struggles. Some people think that mentioning suicide will cause someone to act on the comment. This is not true!


Furthermore, the course caused me to consider the resources in our community for people struggling with suicidal thoughts.

The suicide and crisis lifeline is 988. It is available 24 hours a day.

There is also a myriad of resources in our local community and Sioux Falls that may be helpful to individuals. Though I am, of course, not always immediately available, I am very open to talking with people who are struggling with thoughts of suicide. I promise to do my best to support people and help them connect with appropriate resources/people for their particular needs. Furthermore, from conversations with our local ministerial, I believe that any available pastor would seek to understand, care for and support anyone who is struggling with suicidal thoughts. Please reach out to someone if you are struggling in this way. As Acts 16:28b states, "We are all here!"

Finally, the class talked extensively about how churches in the past have responded to suicides in very harmful ways. Wrongly, shame was cast on individuals and families alike when people died by suicide. In the past, some people wondered whether someone who died by suicide could go to heaven. The pain, isolation and suffering caused by the harsh responses of congregations and Christians to suicide deaths is a sin that we as a church must confess. We are called to work harder to support grieving families and individuals, offering hope instead of more despair. If you lost a loved one by suicide and felt such isolation or condemnation, on behalf of the church, I offer my sincere apologies to you and yours. Though we know suicide is not what God wants, and we know that God has a purpose for all of us each day we are on earth, we also believe that "nothing can separate us from the love of God" (Romans 8:39). This includes death by suicide. My sincere prayer, hope and belief is that God meets people who have died by suicide in their hour of great despair and offers them new life. As a church and as Christian individuals, my prayer is that we would do all we can to offer care and support to family members and friends who have lost a loved one by suicide.

Thank you for supporting me in my efforts to participate in continuing education. I found this course very beneficial. I believe I am a better pastor because of what I learned. Please feel free to reach out to me for more conversation about suicide and loss by suicide.

Message from Pastor Martin

When we lived in west central Minnesota, I was serving in my second call. There was a man in my church who owned a big factory that made plastic signs for people to put on their lawns. They were for every single holiday and time of year. Whenever I went to visit that factory, I noticed that they always worked about six months ahead. In June, for example, Christmas decorations were being developed and made, and so on.

Ministry, I have noticed, often works like that, though not everything a pastor or church leader does can be done that far ahead of time. In order to advertise our churches and their holiday ministries and services on the radio in December, a dialog would have to be written in the summer months, some students would need to be invited to participate and people lined up to cover the cost of the project, then after final arrangements were made (including coordinating it with other media forums) and practices took place, the final dialog could be recorded sometime in November so that it could go out around Thanksgiving. It is a process whose every step calls to mind something our seventh grade Sunday School teacher used to tell us kids nearly every week: every single day you will meet someone who most likely will never meet Jesus or get to know him better if they do not hear about him from you!

Consider the important upcoming holiday and even the seasons of the year that are approaching. What could you do, what gifts have you been given that might be very helpful at any of those times to introduce someone to Jesus or to help almost anyone get to know him a little better? Talk to a church leader or staff person or someone you know right away. It will be summer, then fall, then Christmas before you know it!

College Scholarship Information

High School Seniors and Current College Students

We have put together two information sheets regarding college scholarship financial assistance. Copies are available from the church office after you receive your letter. One is for the "FELC Scholarship" which is potentially available to students attending ANY institution of higher learning. Committee members are Don Craun, Jason Gerdes and Josh Hein.

The other is for the "First Evangelical Lutheran Church of Worthington, Minnesota Scholarship Fund" – commonly called the "LEE ANDERSON SCHOLARSHIP FUND". Eligibility includes college sophomores or higher attending a LUTHERAN COLLEGE OR SEMINARY. Even though **freshman are not eligible**, they SHOULD still complete an application in June of their high school graduation year so their name is put on the list for future consideration. This is explained more on the information sheet. Rolf Mahlberg is the Trustee representing First Lutheran. Stop in or call the church office (376-6148) for copies of either or both information sheets. They contain more information about submission date deadlines and other details.

As soon as you know that you plan to attend an institution of higher learning (even though you may not have yet selected a specific school) please call the church office to enable Natalie to get your name on the list so she can send applications to all interested students. Natalie will send out scholarship application letters in May. You only need to complete ONE application – it will be used by both scholarship committees. Applications should be submitted to the church office by June 28



FELC SCHOLARSHIPS FOR POST HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

Each year any student from FELC is eligible to apply for a FELC Scholarship. The applicant needs to be a graduating high school student or someone currently attending an institution of higher education such as a community college, a state college or private four year college, etc. The amount of the scholarship given will vary and is contingent upon the activity of the investments during the preceding year. Principal amounts for these investments have come from bequests by various members, memorials and personal donations.

High school graduates continuing their education can apply for a scholarship as well as currently enrolled students at higher education establishments. STUDENTS DO NEED TO APPLY EVERY YEAR by June 28 (If you applied last year, you have a shorter application to fill out) to be considered for a scholarship for the ensuing academic year. Criteria for a scholarship will emphasize participation and achievement in service to church and community beginning at confirmation entry up to the present time. Applications are available at the Church Office.


