PASTOR JEANETTE'S ARTICLE

Dear First Lutheran,

On April 8 and 9, I was able to attend a "Keeping Faith" training that was hosted via the Southwest Crisis Center. Much of the training was conducted by Victor Vieth, J.D., M.A., Chief Program Officer and Director of the Center for Faith and Child Protection, Zero Abuse Project. The presentation discussed the emotional and spiritual impacts of abuse on children. The presentation discussed information about recognizing signs of abuse in children. It also detailed ways that faith is sometimes used to justify abuse and neglect. Throughout the training, suggestions were made about how to safeguard children from predators during church youth activities. I was able to take notes about areas we can improve on and I was pleased to hear that we already were doing many things well. The presentation also discussed punishment of children and gave insights for faith leaders about how we can talk about raising children in a better way. Another presenter, Alison Feigh (Jacob Wetterling Resource Center), talked about online safety policies for churches. This presenter also provided tangible ways to talk with kids about "tattling" verses "telling" and what types of secrets can be kept and what types of secrets can not be kept. Though the time was very intense, I am grateful for both the work of the Southwest Crisis Center in providing the information and our church for supporting me in attending the training. This opportunity, furthermore, assists me in completing necessary continuing education as a pastor and was free for all who attended.

On April 25 and 26, Brenda Richards and I were also able to attend a retreat for "Rhythms of Faith." Shetek Lutheran Ministries was one of nine camps selected to receive a grant to foster faith formation in the home. First Lutheran was one of a handful of congregations who was selected to participate in the project. During our retreat, we talked about how faith is best passed down via practices and habits at home. Though some practices are simple (praying before meals), the presenter from Sacred Playgrounds noted that most families nowadays do not do such things. So, as congregations and camps, we have a challenge to help foster these practices and habits. Furthermore, a great deal of time was spent on talking about how we can build on the practices and successes camps have in fostering faith development. As a part of our final session, we talked about how we, as churches, can show support to youth before they attend camp. We also discussed how we can assist youth in sharing their experiences after camp, and help families

continue the "momentum" of faith development that is initiated through camp experiences. This training was free, and, furthermore, the program may have financial benefits for campers and their families, as well. Once again, thank you for supporting me in improving my skills as we pass down our faith in Christ to the next generation together.

College Scholarship Information

High School Seniors and Current College Students

We have put together two information sheets regarding college scholarship financial assistance. Copies are available from the church office after you receive your letter. One is for the "FELC Scholarship" which is potentially available to students attending ANY institution of higher learning. Committee members are Jason Gerdes and Josh Hein.

The other is for the "First Evangelical Lutheran Church of Worthington, Minnesota Scholarship Fund" – commonly called the "LEE ANDERSON SCHOLARSHIP FUND". Eligibility includes college sophomores or higher attending a LUTHERAN COLLEGE OR SEMINARY. Even though **freshman are not eligible**, they SHOULD still complete an application in June of their high school graduation year so their name is put on the list for future consideration. This is explained more on the information sheet. Rolf Mahlberg is the Trustee representing First Lutheran. Stop in or call the church office (376-6148) for copies of either or both information sheets. They contain more information about submission date deadlines and other details.

As soon as you know that you plan to attend an institution of higher learning (even though you may not have yet selected a specific school) please call the church office to enable Natalie to get your name on the list so she can send applications to all interested students. Natalie will send out scholarship application letters in May. You only need to complete ONE application – it will be used by both scholarship committees. Applications should be submitted to the church office by June 27



FELC SCHOLARSHIPS FOR POST HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

Each year any student from FELC is eligible to apply for a FELC Scholarship. The applicant needs to be a graduating high school student or someone currently attending an institution of higher education such as a community college, a state college or private four year college, etc. The amount of the scholarship given will vary and is contingent upon the activity of the investments during the preceding year. Principal amounts for these investments have come from bequests by various members, memorials and personal donations.

High school graduates continuing their education can apply for a scholarship as well as currently enrolled students at higher education establishments. STUDENTS DO NEED TO APPLY EVERY YEAR by June 27 (If you applied last year, you have a shorter application to fill out) to be considered for a scholarship for the ensuing academic year. Criteria for a scholarship will emphasize participation and achievement in service to church and community beginning at confirmation entry up to the present time. Applications are available at the Church Office.

Note: This scholarship is NOT the same as the "Lee Anderson Scholarship Fund".


